

## Most Holy Rosary PTC meeting Minutes

October 8, 2019

1904- Group prayer and mission statement of Most Holy Rosary

1906- Open Forum: B. O'Connor gives an FYI, there aren't enough kick balls for the children to play with. Katie Z informed the group that there were still uninflated balls bought with the "Action for Healthy Kids" grant money. They just needed to be inflated.

1908- Principal's Report: Mr. Bryan went through the events that have happened at the school since September. I.e., 911 memorial and curriculum night (which went very well). He also discussed the upcoming events on the school calendar.

Mr. Bryan talked about the new PE instructor Taylor Charles. States that she is settling in well and the kids love her. She would like to start some new programs and activities. She needs equipment for this. J. Morgan inquired about a PE budget.

1927- Circle back to Principal's report:

Mr. Bryan wanted to address the Urban Catholic schools task force. It is facilitated by Lemoyne School. B. O'Connor and Mr. Bryan are taking part in the studies. He asked B. O'Connor to speak more to the PTC parents about the task force. The task force is set up to examine urban catholic schools. The group is in step 1 of the process. The members are from all of the urban catholic schools. They are visiting their neighboring urban catholic schools and observing the staff and classrooms. They are attempting to get a sense of the environment and culture. There are also committees to look at increasing enrollment in these schools. More to come with the findings.

1930- Old Business:

#### New Business:

- Tail gate is set up for SU vs Duke Game on November 16th. It will be outside in the parking lot, weather permitting. Last year we did it in the Gym because of weather. It worked out well. Bring a dish to pass.
